1. What is the Twin Tiers' Got Talent?

The Twin Tiers' Got Talent is the hometown talent competition of the Twin Tiers of Pennsylvania and New York and sponsored by the Sayre Business Association.

2. Why are you doing this?

Part of our goal as the Sayre Business Association is to recognize local arts and artists in the region, and it is our hope that this event will bring attention to the existing arts community and promote engagement with cultural organizations in Sayre, PA.

3. Who can enter?

Anyone who is a resident of the Twin Tiers can enter; there is no age limit.

4. Is there a cost?

There is no cost to enter or compete.

5. When is the competition?

The competition is at the Sayre Theatre on April 26, 2020 at 3pm. Tickets for adults are \$8.50 online (includes fees) at www.bradfordcountymovies.com/sayre-theatre and \$9 at the door. Student tickets are \$5. Online tickets will be available on April 1, 2020. Tickets will also be available at certain SBA locations listed on the SBA Facebook page.

6. How do I enter?

The official entry form and guidelines lay out the process for entering, but here's the short version: Each entrant must submit a video demo of their performance, along with the official entry form.

7. What genres are welcome? I play Himalayan folk music on the ukulele ... am I welcome?

You sure are! Anyone, performing any genre, can enter. The judges are going to go for a mix of different types of performance for the competition, so the more unique and interesting the performance, the better!

8. Does my demo video have to be of the actual piece I'm going to perform, or can I show you an old video?

You do need to show us the piece you intend to perform if you're selected. We're a family organization and we're responsible for producing a show that is appropriate for everyone. We need to know what you're going to do up onstage. If for some reason you become unable to perform the piece you submit, but you've been selected, contact the BCRAC as soon as possible and we'll figure it out.
